

## **Writing**

This term we are looking at some of Shakespeare's classics. Namely:

The Tempest, Macbeth, 12th Night and Hamlet. If you would like to research others (Romeo and Juliet? Midsummer's night dream?) then please do! Present it in an exciting way..put a new modern twist on it!

With Hamlet, the task is to write your own ghost story. Make sure you use the prompts and plan it carefully. The others have a variety of tasks included. See if you can summarise the stories and put them into different styles, such as a newspaper report, diary, biography, comic strips....whatever you would like to do to turn the stories into easy to understand texts!

Continue with spellings and try to include ambitious vocabulary.

## Miss Gardner's group:

Term 6 we will be recapping our learning from across the year. We usually follow the Read Write Inc Programme but unfortunately you cannot access the programme from home. Therefore, I have uploaded some other home learning that will help you recap your learning from across the year. The home learning focuses on reading a variety of texts (both fiction and non-fiction) and extracting information to answer questions about the text. It also focuses on expanded noun phrases, conjunctions, tenses, rhyming, description and commas in a list.

## Project: Shakespeare and the Elizabethan time

This term, as we are studying Shakespeare's plays, we will be looking at Elizabethan England. This will include studying the life of both Elizabeth and Shakespeare, as well as significant events at the time - including the Spanish Armada.

If you would like to do your own research, you could find out what life was like at the time; write a fact sheet about Mary Queen of Scots; draw a map to show the journeys of Sir Francis Drake; draw or make an Elizabethan costume (full size or dress-a-toy?); make a model of the globe or even cook some Tudor food!

### RE

This term we will be completing the work on Humanists, looking at symbols and life choices.

Then we will move on to look at Creation stories from many different faiths. You can do your own research, maybe looking at the many different African or Australian creation myths.
