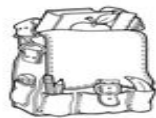

Term 6 we will be revising our learning from across the year. We will be recapping all maths areas such as: addition, subtraction, word problems, time, multiplication, division, money and shape.

Remember to use the RUCSAC method when solving word problems. Here is a diagram to help you with this method:



The **RUCSAC** Method
for solving maths
word problems

R	Read the question carefully	Find the important information - <u>underline</u> it!
U	Understand the question	What do you have to find out? Draw a 'picture' of the question, if it helps.
C	Choose the correct method of calculation	+ - × ÷ What method is best for you to use?
S	Solve the problem	Show every step and keep your working out neat.
A	Answer the question	Read the question again - have you answered it? Make the answer clear.
C	Check your answer	Does it make sense? Find a way to check - estimate or use the inverse.

<p>Foundation subjects/ project overview</p>	<p><u>PSHE.</u></p> <p>This is all about transition this term and how you have been coping with the implications of lockdown.</p> <p><u>ICT</u></p> <p>To complete revision we recommend that you use Education City if you can. If not look, cover, write check your year 5 and 6 statutory spelling lists.</p> <p><u>Project: Shakespeare and the Elizabethan time</u></p> <p>This term, as we are studying Shakespeare's plays, we will be looking at Elizabethan England. This will include studying the life of both Elizabeth and Shakespeare, as well as significant events at the time - including the Spanish Armada.</p> <p>If you would like to do your own research, you could find out what life was like at the time; write a fact sheet about Mary Queen of Scots; draw a map to show the journeys of Sir Francis Drake; draw or make an Elizabethan costume (full size or dress-a-toy?); make a model of the globe or even cook some Tudor food!</p> <p><u>RE</u></p> <p>This term we will be completing the work on Humanists, looking at symbols and life choices.</p> <p>Then we will move on to look at Creation stories from many different faiths. You can do your own research, maybe looking at the many different African or Australian creation myths.</p>
